Monday, March 29 Departure Easter Monday

Tuesday, March 30 Arrival | Orvieto | Assisi

Arrival in Rome. Welcome to Italy! Meet your ProRome Tour Manager and board your private motorcoach for Assisi.

Along the way, the group will stop in the town of Orvieto for an afternoon visit. This beautiful hillside city is home to one of Italy's finest Gothic cathedrals, the Duomo of Orvieto.

Inside this stunning medieval church, pilgrims will venerate a relic of Jesus Christ's Blood: the Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena. In the 13th century, a traveling priest doubted the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Following the words of consecration, the Host spilled blood down the priest's arms and onto the altar cloth. The Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena remains preserved to this day and is the first Church-approved Eucharistic miracle—the inspiration behind the institution of the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Pilgrims will be given free time to explore, pray and sightsee as they wish. Some students may consider visiting St. Patrick's Well, a 16th century engineering marvel which includes 248 spiral steps down into the well.

The group then continues to Assisi, where they will check into a religious guesthouse in the historical center. Group dinner together.

Wednesday, March 31 Assisi

After breakfast, enjoy a walking tour of Assisi as the group enters into the life and legacy of Saint Francis and Saint Clare.

The tour includes the Basilica of Saint Francis, beginning in the crypt where Saint Francis is buried and culminating in the Upper Basilica, where Giotto's magnificent frescoes depicting the saint's life adorn the walls. Next, the group proceeds to the Basilica of Saint Clare to venerate her tomb and the San Damiano crucifix that spoke to Saint Francis more than 800 years ago, asking him to "repair the Church which is falling into disrepair." Free time for lunch. For those who want to cut their lunch break short, there will be an option to enjoy the Rocca Maggiore hike before the afternoon tours begin.

The afternoon continues with visits to the Cathedral of San Rufino, the Chiesa Nuova, and the Church of Saint Mary Major, where pilgrims will pray at the final resting place of Saint Carlo Acutis. Before dinner, the group will visit the Porziuncola chapel—the original home of the Franciscan Order and the place of Saint Francis's death—housed within the great baroque Basilica of Saint Mary of the Angels.

Thursday, April 1 Assisi | Loreto | San Giovanni Rotondo

Following breakfast, depart for San Giovanni Rotondo, stopping in the coastal city of Loreto along the way. Loreto is home to one of Europe's most sacred sanctuaries: the Holy House of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Here pilgrims will experience the mystery of the Annunciation in a profound way, as this is the very place where the Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary,

announcing the Incarnation. Crusaders likely brought this holy relic to Italy during the Middle Ages, and studies confirm that the building techniques and designs match those found at the site of the Holy House in Nazareth.

Continue to San Giovanni Rotondo, the home of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio). Check into the hotel and enjoy a group dinner together.

Friday, April 2 San Giovanni Rotondo | Monte Sant'angelo

After breakfast, tour San Giovanni Rotondo and visit the sites associated with the life and ministry of Saint Pio. Visit the Sanctuary of Santa Maria delle Grazie, where Padre Pio lived, prayed, and bore the stigmata for 50 years. Venerate his tomb in the modern sanctuary dedicated to his memory. Free time for lunch.

In the afternoon, take an excursion to Monte Sant'Angelo to visit the Sanctuary of Saint Michael the Archangel. This sacred grotto is one of the oldest pilgrimage sites in Christianity, where according to tradition, the Archangel Michael appeared multiple times in the late 5th and early 6th centuries. The sanctuary has been a destination for pilgrims for over 1,500 years. Return to San Giovanni Rotondo for dinner.

Saturday, April 3 San Giovanni Rotondo | Monte Cassino | Rome

After breakfast, depart for Rome, stopping at Monte Cassino along the way. Monte Cassino is the mountaintop monastery and motherhouse of the Benedictine Order. This sacred site holds the tombs of Saint Benedict and his sister, Saint Scholastica. Enjoy a guided tour and time for individual prayer before continuing to Rome.

Arrive in Rome and check into a religious guesthouse in the historical center, located within a few hundred meters of St. Peter's Basilica—a ProRome Tours promise thanks to our strong network of religious guesthouses in the Vatican area. Group dinner together.

Sunday, April 4 Mass with the Pope | Catacombs | St. Paul

After breakfast, enjoy some free time before joining tens of thousands of Catholics for Divine Mercy Sunday Mass with the Holy Father in St. Peter's Square! There is an option to climb to the top of Michelangelo's dome for

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the most incredible panorama of Rome.

At 12:00 PM, join the Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, for the Angelus prayer in St. Peter's Square.

Following the Angelus, proceed to the Via Appia for a group lunch at Ristorante Cecilia Metella, located across from the Catacombs of St. Sebastian. After lunch, enjoy a guided tour of the Catacombs of St. Sebastian, named for the soldier-martyr buried and venerated there.

Continue to the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls, the second-largest church in Rome, built over the tomb of St. Paul, which is visible from the confessio in front of the high altar. The tour recalls the story of St. Paul's martyrdom and burial in Rome. The basilica has a fascinating history, from its consecration in 402 to the devastating fire of 1823 and its subsequent rebuilding aided by donations from around the world.

Group dinner to conclude the day.

Monday, April 5

Ancient Rome | The Lateran | Holy Cross

After breakfast, visit the Basilica of Saint Agnes Outside the Walls, for Mass and veneration of our patroness, Saint Agnes. Following Mass, explore ancient Rome, including the Roman Forum, the Colosseum, and the Basilica of San Clemente. Here the group will discover the story of Rome from its founding in the 8th century BC through its fall in the 5th century AD. Free time for lunch during the tour.

In the afternoon, visit the Cathedral of Rome, the Lateran Basilica, built by Emperor Constantine in the 4th century. Known as mater et caput—mother and head of all the churches of the world—it remains the official seat of the Bishop of Rome. We will also be sure to stop and briefly visit the Obelisk

located right outside of the Lateran Basilica as well. Here the group will also find the Holy Stairs, the very stairs Christ ascended when brought to trial at Pontius Pilate's Praetorium. The stairs are climbed on one's knees out of respect for our Lord and His Passion. Nearby is the Basilica of Holy Cross in Jerusalem, which safeguards relics of Christ's Passion, including a large piece of the True Cross and nails from the Crucifixion.

Tuesday, April 6

Vatican Museums | Saint Peter's Basilica | Centro Storico

After breakfast, tour the Vatican Museums and Sistine Chapel. Founded in the 16th century, the Vatican Museums preserve the world's greatest collections of Early Christian, Medieval, and Renaissance art. Following the Sistine Chapel, the tour continues into Saint Peter's Basilica. Following the tour there will be free time for lunch. Founded in the 16th century, the Vatican Museums preserve the world's greatest collections of Early Christian, Medieval, and Renaissance art. Free time for lunch.

The afternoon is dedicated to exploring the Centro Storico (historic center) at a leisurely pace. The tour highlights the Catholic Counter-Reformation through the saints, religious orders, art, and architecture of this transformative movement. Pilgrims will visit Rome's most beloved sites, including the Basilica of Saint Mary Major to venerate sacred relics including the manger in which Christ was born, the Madonna Salus Populi Romani (Rome's most important Marian image), and the tomb of Pope Saint Pius V.

Continue to Piazza Navona—once the Stadium of Domitian—crowned by the baroque church

of Sant'Agnese and Bernini's celebrated Fountain of the Four Rivers. The nearby Pantheon is one of the most architecturally significant buildings ever constructed. This Christianized pagan temple, completed around 125 AD by Emperor Hadrian, remains the only fully intact building from Roman antiquity. Originally dedicated to planetary deities, it was consecrated as a church in 609 and dedicated to Saint Mary and the Martyrs.

Additional time allows for exploring charming side streets, enjoying gelato, and personal reflection at Rome's beautiful churches. Farewell group dinner together.

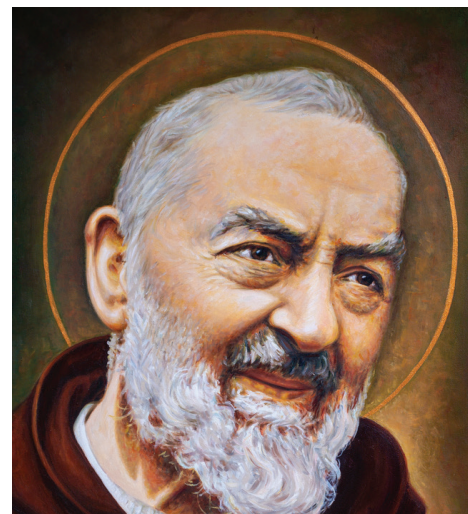
